Like you, I have watched my parents struggle as senior citizens to try and enjoy their retirement, and like most of you, I have had to cut back so my children could get a good education so they could start their adult lives with college and grad school behind them.



Politically incorrect things that need to be said because our Country and our future are too important.

Well, Election Day is finally upon us and we have the chance to take back America. We have the chance to oust the anti-union, antiworker cabal that not only wants four more years of the same, but even make it worse for America's working class. And we have the chance to elect a President and a Congress that will be sympathetic to our needs, to our senior citizens' needs and to our children's needs.

In the center pages of this issue of The Eagle we hi-light the positions of John McCain and Barack Obama on issues that affect America's working families. You will see that they are diametrically opposed – and to you and I, union men and women, this is really a good thing. When you read it, it will leave no doubt who stands with us and who stands against us. John McCain wants to tax our healthcare benefits, the same benefits that we gave up things for at the bargaining table so our families will have good health insurance. He has an education plan that will do nothing to help families pay for college and he is being a George Bush clone by still wanting to gamble with our retirement and privatize social security. As AFL-CIO Secretary-Treasurer Richard Trumka put it, "Any retiree voting for John McCain is like a chicken voting for Colonel Sanders."

But enough about their positions, that's on pages 4 and 5. Let's talk about Vice Presidential Candidate Sarah Palin. Is this politically incorrect since many in the news media don't want to be labeled sexist or racist? Well, she put her family



on the back burner and asked to be in the limelight, so she's fair game as far as I'm concerned. When the Republican Party lowered the bar and she met their standards, we saw a person with very lightweight credentials be picked to potentially run our country. Give her credit. She did what she was supposed to do. In classic Carl Roveian manner, she took the spotlight off John McCain and the issues facing our country, and instead we heard about mooseburgers, lipstick, guns and hockey. I know some CWA Local presidents that are responsible for a lot more people than that and (no offense) they certainly aren't qualified to be Vice President. She says we need a change - a change from a liberal Washington to a conservative Washington. Well, let me remind her (and you) that George W. Bush, a conservative Republican, has been president for eight years and until last year, the Conservatives controlled the House and the Senate. Sarah Palin, I'm not

OBAMA

Trade

Wants FAIR TRADE – not free trade. Will only accept agreements with worker, environmental and trade protections, and wants to renegotiate NAFTA for better standards.

Workers

Co-sponsored EFCA and has said that it will be one of the first bills he signs into law when it gets to his desk. Voted against the Right to Work for Less law because it took away union's rights to

> bargain for it members. Voted against tax cuts for the rich and voted for raising the minimum wage



JOBS

Voted for the amendment to prohibit outsourcing of government jobs and against the privatization of federal jobs. Voted for extending federal unemployment insurance benefits and successfully fought against giving a \$35 billion contract to a foreign country to keep the work in America.

Social Security

Is opposed to raising the retirement age or reduce the benefits – and is opposed to privatization.

McCAIN

Trade

Has cast vote after vote for EVERY free trade agreement, Has gone on to praise NAFTA and its effects and voted to make it easier for the President enter into agreement without labor protections

Workers

Voted against the EFCA, the most important piece of legislation to level the playing field for workers to join an union and bargain for better wages, benefits and working conditions. He voted for a National Right to Work for Less law that would federally mandate a ban on union security agreements. He opposed granting collective bargaining rights to Airport Screeners (TSAs). He supported Bush's tax cuts for the wealthy while voting against raising the minimum wage.

JOBS

Voted against an amendment that would prohibit the outsourcing of government job and voted for the privatization of federal jobs. Voted to support contracting out federal jobs and voted against extending federal unemployment insurance benefits. Lobbied for a European company to win a \$35 billion contract for a Air Force Tanker over U.S. made Boeing.

Social Security

Wants to raise the retirement age to 68 for benefits, wants to reduce the scheduled benefits, and wants to privatize the system by giving it to Wall Street – the very same markets that went in the tank last month and the same plan that Americans rejected in '05

But There is Only One Choice

OBAMA

Healthcare

His healthcare plan includes guaranteed eligibility and access to affordable health care for all. He wants businesses to pay into a national insurance pool if they are not providing health benefits to employees. Voted against cuts in Medicare and Medicaid and not just wants to keep the SCHIP program in place but improve it.

Equal pay for Women

Is for Equal pay for everyone

Environment

Plans a reduction of industrial carbon emissions in accordance with scientific data.

Taxes

Wants to reduce the taxes for anyone earning less than \$50,000. This makes almost every retiree eligible for this tax break.

Veterans

Co-sponsored bill that got \$1.5 billion increase in veteran's medical care AND authored the Homes for Heroes Act that provides services and housing options to veterans.

Other Labor Issues

Never crossed a picket line and wrote Verizon CEO Ivan Seidenberg demanding that all work at any of his HQ's be done by union people only and not subcontracted out and trade protections, and wants to renegotiate NAFTA for better standards.

McCain

Healthcare

His healthcare plan have all workers with employer-based healthcare pay taxes on it (that's every union-negotiated plan in the country) and will force all other working families into the costly private sector. Voted to slash funding for Medicare and gut Medicaid by \$14 billion and opposed re-funding for SCHIP – State Children's Health Insurance Program.

Equal Pay for Women

Opposed the Senate bill for equal pay for women.

Environment

Received a zero rating from the Sierra Club for is environmental record and is close with oil companies.

Taxes

Wants to keep the tax breaks for those for the richest of Americans – those in the top 1% income bracket – the only ones that can actually afford a tax

increase.

Veterans

Voted in 2005, 2007 & 2007 against funding for Veterans benefits AND voted against \$19 billion for military hospitals.

Other Labor Issues

Crossed picket lines. Voted to hire permanent replacements for striking workers and wants to outsource and privatize government jobs if elected.
